Trial Site & Information

The show site is indoors on turf. Please bring your own crate, mat, clean up supplies, and water for your dog. Limited crating on the black colored matting just inside the front door.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, except when in the ring or at the practice jump.

One warm up jump per ring will be provided.

Site is Central Southern NJ, very close to the intersection of NJ-70 and US 206 and convenient to several exits of the New Jersey Turnpike.

Trial Site Rules

Exhibitors are resp<mark>onsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. This is a **NON-SMOKING PROPERTY.** Absolutely no smoking on our property with the only exception in your car with your cigarette butts deposited inside your car.</mark>

<u>Preliminary Run Orders:</u> Running orders for the preliminary rounds will be posted on https://k9trialservices.com. Preliminary rounds of each event will be random, with adjustments made for handlers w/ multiple dogs.

Camping/RV: Dry Camping only: \$25.00 per night, payable upon arrival. Cash or check only...come prepared. Checks are to be made out to Premier Sports Center. No other forms of payment will be accepted. All RVs must be parked by the Premier staff. Bitches in Season – Are allowed to run at this event.

Note from Premier Sports Center. Since this is a regional event with exhibitors traveling from a greater distance, we have decided to make an exception for the Jersey Devil Classic. This does not mean we have had a change in policy for all future UKI trials. BIS will run in their running order but must start on a mat provided by the show. You must notify the show management of any BIS. BIS pants may be worn but are expressly done under the handler's risk.

UKI US Classic - General Rules

- This event is open to all dogs and handlers irrespective of their level in UKI and their organization affiliation.
- There is no pre-qualification necessary to enter classes.
- There is a separate competition for each jump height.
- Dogs and handlers need to be UKI members. Register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com
- Dogs may only compete in one height throughout the whole event.
- Handlers who are collecting points for US Open or WCO Byes, must be the same dog and handler partnership that compete in these events and at the Open and must run in the height that the Q's and Byes were gained at.
- Classes will be run in strict running order unless otherwise specified. Running orders will be randomly drawn for the first round of each class of Biathlon, Pentathlon and Masters Series Heat.
- Classes will be run under UKI rules and regulations with additional rules detailed below. Any further amendments will be posted and or announced.
- At the event management's discretion, individual runs of the Classic Biathlon or Classic Pentathlon can be entered. Those competitors can compete for a qualifying leg and if clear, earn 4 level points regardless how the result compares to the others in the class. They also are not counted in the tournament tallies or given any results placement. If they receive a clean run, the dog's result will be recorded as the course time so as no comparison and placement will be made with those entered in the tournament.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules. Any amendments to these rules will be announced to competitors either in the confirmation information or general briefings.

<u>UKI Classic Pentathlon Winners</u> – The Winners of the Speedstakes Final from the Classic Pentathlon in each jump height <u>will</u> receive an automatic Bye into the Speedstakes Challenge Final at the 2024 UKI US Open Florida and a bye into the Speedstakes Challenge Final at the 2024 West Coast Open, plus an automatic Bye into the Masters Series Final at the 2024 UKI US Open Florida

<u>Classic Biathlon Winners</u> - If the Winners of the Overall Placement of the Classic Biathlon in each jump height win without an E in either class, they will receive an automatic Bye into Round 2 of the UKI National Championship Class at the 2024 UKI US Open Florida.

Biathlon

- Consists of a Jumping round and Agility round with the results combined.
- Either round can be run first. Running order for second round will be in reverse order of first round results.
- Cumulative scoring: least faults wins with time as tie breaker only, in all aspects of the Biathlon.
- In the event of a tie for the Agility Biathlon Winner, the scores from the Agility round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the result of jumping run will determine the winner, and if necessary, then the dogs will compete in a run-off on the last biathlon course.
- Eliminations in first round will still progress to second round, with E's running random in the beginning of the RO for the second round.
- Double eliminations will not be placed.

Pentathlon

- Consists of 4 preliminary classes with points allocated for placements in each class that are combined into one result to enable participation to run in the Final.
- The 4 preliminary classes include: Snooker, Gamblers, Agility & Jumping designed under the Senior level guidelines and are run and scored under UKI Rules & Regulations.
- The Final consists of a Speedstakes course and is run and scored under normal UKI Rules & Regulations.
- The tabulation for each of the 4 preliminary classes is based upon the number of dogs entered within each jump height in each event. The winner of the class (i.e. Snooker) will receive the highest points which is equal to the total number entered in that jump height. Example: If 12 dogs are entered in the 22 inch height then the winner will receive 12 points, 2nd place 11, 3rd place 10 and so on.
- Eliminations (dogs not stopping the timers by going over the finish jump in Gamblers and Snooker) will score 0 points.
- Eliminations in Jumping or Agility will score 0 points.
- A no show in any of the classes or if any of the classes are run for NFC will result in a loss of eligibility to move onto the Final, regardless of ranking in the other classes.
- The top 50% from the 4 preliminary rounds will progress onto the Speedstakes Final.
- Dogs with 3 or more 0 scoring results in preliminary classes will not progress onto the Final.
- The bottom 50%, including those that scored three or more zeros, will move onto the Speedstakes Consolation Run that is scored under normal UKI Rules & Regulations. The running order for the Consolation class will be random draw.
- A tie at the 50% cut off will round up to move all tied dogs into the Final.
- The running orders for the preliminary classes will be random order.
- The running orders for the Final will be reverse order of the combined result of the preliminary score after the 4 rounds. If there is a tie for running order placement, the Agility placement followed by the Jumping placement, followed by the Gamblers placement will determine the running order.

Managing Conflicts for Handlers with Multiple Dogs in Non-Seeded Classes

In the initial classes of each event (non-seeded runs) a random draw will produce the running order. Handlers with more than one dog will have their running orders altered to achieve the following:

- A gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs) will be created by moving the first-drawn dog earlier in the running order. If this does not achieve a 10-dog gap then the second-drawn dog will be moved down in the running order.
- If there are not enough dogs in the class to achieve the 10-dog gap the biggest gap possible will be created. If this gap does not achieve the minimum 10 dog gap, then a break of 6 minutes will be given. The 6 minute countdown will start as the handler's first dog crosses the finish line; the handler must enter the ring with their second dog before the countdown is complete.
- Handlers with more than 2 dogs will have their dogs split using the 10-dog gap rule. If there are not enough dogs to achieve this, the dogs will be split evenly through the running order and the 6 minute rule will be adhered to. If a handler has dogs in different height divisions, and the 10 dog gap cannot be achieved, the 6 minutes will run through while the jump heights are being changed.

Multiple dog conflicts in Seeded classes:

In the seeded classes a handler has earned their running order and the advantage this brings; therefore, their dogs will not be automatically moved to create a gap. Instead, they will be given 6 minute break between dogs. However, a handler may choose to move their first dog to a spot earlier in the running order to create a gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs). If this is unable to be achieved, the 6 minute rule will be used. A handler must notify the results office within 30 minutes of the results being posted of the previous class in that particular event if they wish to move their running order for the next round. Failure to do so will mean they will be given a 6 minute break. By entering more than one dog in this event, handlers indicate their acceptance to comply with these rules.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International in order to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free on registration of Handler/Owner to UKI. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of **UK Agility International rules and regulations** including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UK Agility International Trials, with the exception of dogs over 15 calendar months of age eligible to compete in Nursery Classes & Speedstakes.

Entries without fees paid in full will be returned. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or Guardian if the competitor is a minor.

Refund Policy

Entries will not be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date or capping level has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level. A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the creation of the account date. A full refund is available before the closing date or capping level is met for any show. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, a 5% administration fee for a credit card refund will be assessed, per transaction. After the closing date, a partial entry may be available for extraordinary circumstances, but this lies with the individual show management based upon their own policies. Contact the show management for details, NOT UKI.

Payment of entry fees and Instant Account Top up Fees shall be made directly to the UKI member account, or via payment directly to the trial before a competitor may compete. If your UKI account owes money on the closing date, when entries are processed, please be sure you have arranged for payment to be made directly to the show and not latterly paid via your

UKI member account. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls to a UK Agility International account must be paid within 14 days. UK Agility International will suspend a dog's/handlers' registration, until fees are paid in full. Failure to do this will result in your UKI account being suspended.

Additional administration charges may be imposed to members' account due to negligence that result in administration time to correct. Possible infractions, but not limited to are: submitting incorrect trial entry information, including incorrect handler and dog number, creating duplicate membership or dog accounts. Charges are based on an hourly rate of \$20 per hour.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal or if it is likely to cause itself damage or suffering if it continues competing.

There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn and neither in the event a dog and/or handler is dismissed from the competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal providing this was within accordance of UK Agility International rules and regulations.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken the show management and UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.

It is expressly understood that **Competitors alone are responsible** for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, may at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. No refunds of fees will be made in such a case.

Dogs left in hot cars, or dogs appearing to be in distress, will be dealt with as seen fit by the Show Management.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility International. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the SHOW MANAGEMENT may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

Media Rights Release: Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

<u>Rules of Conduct</u>: UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions.

Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the UKI event that their participation is a privilege and not a right. By virtue of their entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations and agree to accept any sanctions that may be imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring based on matters related to competitor misconduct. The UKI show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI head officials, through further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or UKI officials may take action: Abuse of a dog on the
grounds \square Actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog \square Willful misconduct or interference with a
competitor's right to show \square Any acts of poor sportsmanship \square Violation of procedural rules \square Compulsive, correctional
training on the grounds Willful misrepresentation on entry forms Willful misrepresentation of animals Dog
aggression ☐ Failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog. ☐ Intimidation and/or impolite
confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors Creating excessive delays as a failure to
respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct rule is in effect. Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may sanction removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.

<u>Speedstakes Tournament:</u> The speedstakes tournament on Friday is a 2 round optional warmup class. All competitors will run a single course in each round regardless of individual level. Clear rounds in either run will count towards your Speedstakes titles. Level points for clear rounds will be rewarded as a single open level class. The tournament will be scored on a time plus faults format. The top three overall placements per jump height will win awards.

<u>Hotels near Premier Sports Center:</u> The hotel information provided below is not guaranteed to be correct. About UKI

Speedstakes Titling Program

SS Beginners: For dogs that are not eligible for SS Novice, SS Senior and SS Champion levels in the Speed Stakes Program.

SS Novice: For dogs that have gained a minimum of 12 points in the SS Beginners classes. Or a newly registered dog who is eligible for Beginners, but the owner/handler currently runs a Champ level dog in the International Program.

SS Senior: For dogs that have gained a minimum of 20 points in the SS Novice classes.

SS Champion: For dogs that have gained a minimum of 36 points in the SS Senior classes.

International Titling Program

Beginners: For dogs that are not eligible for Novice, Senior and Champion levels in the International Program

Novice: For dogs that have gained a minimum of 12 points, where 8 of those points must be obtained in agility classes. Or a newly registered dog who is eligible for Beginners, but the owner/handler currently runs a Champ level dog in the International Program.

Senior: For dogs that have gained a minimum of 20 points in the Novice classes, where 12 of those points must be obtained in agility classes, 4 from jumping, and 4 from games.

Champion: For dogs that have gained a minimum of 36 points in Senior classes, where 12 of those points must be obtained in agility classes, 12 from jumping, & 12 from games

Masters Series Tournament Rules

The aim of Masters is to encourage more competitive running in UKI classes and improve the overall standard of top level agility. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both National and International level.

General Rules

Open to all UKI level dogs including Select heights. Separate competition for each height. Agility and Jumping rounds with results combined. Handlers must run in strict running orders, failure to do so will result in elimination. Either Agility or Jumping classes may run first. If a handler has 2 dogs entered within a jump height, they may move their first dog up so that there are as many dogs as possible between their dogs. If this is not possible, they will receive a 6-minute break. If a handler has more than 2 dogs within a jump height and the entry is not large enough for a sufficient gap in between all their dogs, the first of their dogs drawn will be allowed to run in between a jump height change, if a jump height change is available before their height. If it is not, the final decision will be made by the judge and show manager, taking into consideration fairness to the competitor and other entrants in the Masters Class. Day of Entries must run first within the running orders of the first class. The second class must run in reverse order of placing from first class. The dog must run in the height that he will compete at in the Masters Final. The same dog and handler must run both rounds. Only the handler who qualifies the dog through a Masters Heat, may run the dog in the US Open Masters Final. Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UKI.

Scoring

Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. Time faults treated the same as course faults. An elimination = 100 faults plus 60 second course time. An absent or NFC run = 1000 faults with a 60 second course time. Dogs with an absent or NFC run in either the Agility or Jumping will forfeit any Q's or awards gained in the other round; in other words, both rounds must be run for competition. Dogs with double elimination will not be placed. An E in the individual round will not be placed in that round. Dogs with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. In the event of a tie, the Agility result will be the deciding factor, followed by the jumping result. If a tie still remains, a runoff will be required.

Final Qualification: 2 ways to qualify for the Final to be held at the UKI US Open:

A. Individual Winners (per height) of the Masters Agility or	B. 1st & 2nd Overall (per height) (even if an E is earned

Prizes:
