Checking In

You do not need to check in unless you still owe entry fees or have your dog(s) measured.

In an attempt to reduce paper waste, we will be utilizing the Agility Gate app. This app can be downloaded and used for free on both android and IOS devices. The app allows you to check in, scratch or mark your run as NFC from your own device. You can also check to see which dog is currently running. There will be a tv near each ring which will be “mirroring” the gate stewards device so you can watch the run order while waiting to run your dog. You will need to use the competitor code 2006 to access the running order once you select the Jersey Devil Tournament.

Bitches in Season – Are allowed to run at this event.

Note from Premier Sports Center. Since this is a special event with exhibitors traveling from a greater distance, we have decided to make an exception for the Jersey Devil Classic. This does not mean we have had a change in policy for all future UKI trials. BIS will run in their running order but must start on a mat provided by the show. You must notify the show management of any BIS. BIS pants may be worn but are expressly done under the handler's risk.

Food

There will not be a food vendor on site. Please plan/pack accordingly.

Volunteers

Help from competitors is not only appreciated but is necessary to conduct a smooth-running show. Please see our ring managers to volunteer to work. We have lots of great raffle prizes for those who volunteer.

Scoring and Results Posting

There will be a TV monitors scrolling scores as they are entered into the computer. Please check these monitors to ensure your score is correct as soon as possible after your run.

Class results will be posted on <https://k9trialservices.com> shortly after the completion of each class.

Please note that any scoring discrepancies MUST be brought to the attention of Dan Burke within 30 minutes of the results being posted for any class.

Running Orders

The running orders for the preliminary rounds will not be emailed to each competitor and will be available online at <https://k9trialservices.com>. If you do not have a gap of 10 or more dogs in between multiple dogs, please see Dan Burke to move one of your dogs. You may NOT move in the running order without the permission of either Dan. If we are not able to create a 10-dog gap, you will be given 6 minutes between your dogs. The 6 minute countdown will start as the handler's first dog crosses the finish line; the handler must enter the ring with their second dog before the countdown is complete.

Measuring Dogs

Please ensure you understand the new criteria regarding dogs being measured. UKI Rule Book edition 10 If a dog is under 3 and newly registered, a temporary measure or proof of the dog's height must be done by the dog's 3rd trial. A permanent measure must be obtained by a UKI official measurer between 12-18 months after the dog's first/ temporary measure. Any registered dog that only has a temporary measure, must follow the above rule. If a newly registered dog is over 3, they must obtain a measure by an official UKI measurer by their 3rd trial and this measurement will be permanent. Measuring will take place near ring 1 prior to the first class.

Parking/Crating

There is limited climate controlled indoor crating available on a first come first served basis. Crating is only allowed in designated areas. You must bring a tarp to place under your crate.

Car/Van Parking: In addition to the front paved lot, we also have a grass field out back behind the building. There is a side driveway on the right side of the building to access the back field. You can also park along the side of the building and along the tree line next to the driveway. Please park efficiently... do not leave more space between you and the next car than what a normal parking space would allow. If you allow too much space or double park you will be asked to move. Please do not park out on the circle or in any business neighbor's lot. Please do not park your car in the front field or alongside the tree line that faces the front paved lot. Those areas are reserved for RVs. There is very limited handicapped parking, please arrive early to obtain a spot.

RV Parking:

RV's must be parked by the staff. When you arrive, pull up front and park in the fire lane with your blinkers on. Text Sue Bintliff when you arrive to be parked: 609-410-0889. If she does not answer your text, come inside to find her to be parked. This is also where you can fill your fresh water tank if needed.

We will be there on Thursday evening until 8:00pm to park RV's. If you arrive after 5:00pm on Friday or Saturday eve when no one is there to park you. Park in the paved lot only. Take as few parking spots as possible. Be prepared to be moved in the am possibly.

Do not assume it is ok to park yourself on the grass..depends on how much rain we have had. No RV's along side of the building. If you want to park next to someone you can let me know that when you arrive and we will find a spot where you can save space for your friend.

Online Results

All clear rounds/qualifying results will be available to view at <https://ukagilityinternational.com> within 2 weeks of the trial. You will be able to log on to your account and see results that were clear rounds, gaining level points.

Sports Center Hours

The Center will close, and doors will be locked approximately one hour after the last run has been completed for the day. Be prepared.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted inside our facility and not encouraged outside near others. We prefer if you must smoke that it is done inside your vehicle and that your butts are discarded in your vehicle ashtray.

NFC & Repeat and Move On

Not For Competition (NFC) and Repeat and Move On (RMO) will be allowed in all runs. A maximum course time will be enforced during all NFC/RMO runs.

Maximum Course Time

All eliminations and NFC runs will be given a maximum course time of 60 seconds. A single buzzer will sound at 50 seconds as a warning and multiple horns will sound at the 60 second mark, at which time you must leave the ring immediately. For Gamblers, you must leave the ring on the second horn, there is no reattempting the Gamble after the 2nd horn.

Dog Exercise Areas

Premier Sports Center has 4 acres of grass for you and your dogs to enjoy. All dogs need to be on a leash and under control at all times while on Premier Sports Center property. The only exceptions for off leash are when at the practice jump or in the ring. Poop bags are to be discarded in outside trash receptacles only. Do not walk your dog on our business neighbor's properties. Pay attention to your dog and pick up after your dog. Anyone seen in person or on video not picking up after their dog or walking on the neighbor's property will be subject to a bench hearing and immediate excusal from the Center for the remaining day(s) of the trial. Do not let your male dog lift its leg on the building, front landscaping, or on any item a human needs to handle.

Please be considerate of the public restrooms. Trash cans will be placed in the bathrooms for proper disposal of paper products other than toilet paper. No dogs allowed in public restrooms. Personal chairs/handicap chairs will not be allowed on the turf field. We will provide bench seating in the front of the rings for all to use. Please remove your personal belongings when your class has ended.

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Tournament Definitions & Scoring Procedures

The “Cryptid Quartet” Tournament: The “cryptid quartet” tournament is a 4-round event for competitors entered in the Senior/Champ level of the 4 classes (Agility, Jumping, Snooker, Gamblers) on Saturday. To be eligible for tournament inclusion, competitors must be entered in all 4 classes at the S/C levels. Each class in the tournament is scored pursuant to Senior/Champ rules. Agility and Jumping will be scored on a time plus faults basis and will be subtracted from the standard point value for the class as per the table below. Gamblers and snooker will be scored on a point basis with each score multiplied by a weighting number to balance the points earned in each class. The sum of all points will be combined to determine the overall score. Top 3 placements in each height (regular and select will be scored together) will be awarded. An elimination will be assessed faults equal to 60% of the standard point value for the class. A “not for competition” run will be assessed faults equal to 75% of the standard point value for the class and a “no show” will be assessed faults equal to 100% of the standard point for the class.

Banshee Speedstakes Challenge: This tournament is open to competitors that enter both rounds of speedstakes on Sunday at either the Senior or Champion level. A clear round in either of the speedstakes class will be awarded level points towards title progression. The scoring for the “Banshee” Speedstakes Challenge podium will be scored on a time plus faults basis. A score of elimination will be scored as SCT+60 faults and a score of NFC will be scored at SCT+75 faults. Senior and Champion will be scored together. All select heights will be scored with their regular jump height. Scores from the two rounds will be combined with podium finishes for the top 3 overall placements in each jump height.

Wozzlebug Speedstakes Challenge: This tournament is open to competitors that enter both rounds of speedstakes on Sunday at either the Beginner or Novice level. A clear round in either of the speedstakes class will be awarded level points towards title progression. The scoring for the “Wozzlebug” Speedstakes Challenge podium will be scored on a time plus faults basis. A score of elimination will be scored as SCT+60 faults and a score of NFC will be scored at SCT+75 faults. Beginner and Novice will be scored together. All select heights will be scored with their regular jump height. Scores from the two rounds will be combined with podium finishes for the top 3 overall placements in each jump height.

The Jersey Devil Finals: This tournament is open to competitors in both the S/C and B/N levels. To be eligible to be scored for the Finals, competitors must be entered in both Agility and Jumping (at their applicable level). The agility and jumping classes will be judged pursuant to UKI judging policies for the applicable levels. Tournament scoring for the agility and jumping classes will be scored on a time plus faults basis and will be subtracted from the standard point value for the class as per the table below. An elimination will be scored as SCT+60. “NFC” will be scored as SCT+75 faults. The top 3 placements per jump height (regular and select combined) from the Senior/Champ level and the top 3 placements per jump height (regular and select combined) from the Beginner/Novice level will gain entry into the Jersey Devil Open Speedstakes Finals at no cost to the competitor. The finals will consist of an open level Speedstakes course that will be judged and scored pursuant to Senior rules. Top 3 placements for each height (regular and select scored together) will be awarded. The Jersey Devil Open Speedstakes Finals is a “for fun” run and therefore no qualifying scores can be earned by competitors’ participation.
